One of the Club's greatest accomplishments in 2023 the rebuilding and expansion of our Teen Room at the McGraw Family Clubhouse. This dedicated safe space offers a wide range of programs, homework assistance, career exploration, and enriching activities, all free of charge thanks to our decision to eliminate all fees for Teens this year.

The impact has been remarkable, with our average daily attendance increasing three times and our

number of registered teen members more than doubled. Activities such as kayaking, hiking in Leavenworth, a visit to Silverwood Theme Park, Teen Nights, and college tours have enriched the experiences of our teens, fostering growth and exploration.

A WORD FROM KIM POPE, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



"This past year has been tremendous in our clubs, and we have all of you to thank for our success! Over the past 12 months, our members filled our clubhouses, even bursting at the seams in our Teen Center. Our club kids had new opportunities, including a jam-packed family fun night, a teen hiking journey, a special painting class, a water safety and kayaking adventure, field trips to colleges and local businesses, and a fabulous day at Silverwood! None of these experiences happen without the thoughtfulness of our community friends.

Last year we received special funding for a Behavioral Support Specialist. Supporting that position, our state legislators sponsored a funding request for us to build a Mental Health Quiet Room. Construction will begin as soon as possible, allowing us to have a dedicated space for club kids to decompress when overwhelmed. In addition, we were able to

hire a Child Nutrition Coordinator. Plans to grow more in our greenhouse, teach more cooking classes, and improve the healthy eating of our club kids are underway.

And you helped us feed our community! The number of snacks and meals we served in our clubhouses and free summer food distribution sites increased tremendously. As we have said many times, it's not just that we want to feed these children, we **need** to feed these children.

In 2024, we plan to continue our efforts to improve our club members' social and emotional health and assist in workforce development and readiness. Thank you for allowing us to encourage every youth who comes to our clubs to become the best version of themselves. I am honored to lead this great team and serve the families in our community."
